- 3. What were your goals in writing this book?**

- 5. What's your take on learning styles, and do you think parents and teachers should be doing more with them?**
- 6. Is there anything that a busy teacher can do to teach students with very different learning styles?**
- 7. What can parents do to help when their child is struggling in school?**
- 8. Can talents and disabilities coexist in the same person?**
- 9. What is stealth dyslexia?**
- 10. You talk about attention not being a single process, what do you mean by that?**
- 11. Do you think drugs ever important for children with attention problems? Is there an alternative to drugs?**
- 12. In your book you talk about seeing many children misdiagnosed with autism spectrum disorders. Is that a big problem in your opinion?**
- 13. You also have a chapter on sensory processing disorder: that's a very controversial diagnosis, isn't it?**
- 14. Why is there a chapter on gifted children in a book on learning challenges?**
- 15. Did you learn much from writing this book together?**
- 16. What is the single most important concept you would like to see the people who read your book coming away with?**
